NILAGIRIS ASHRAM

The Ashram of the Blue mountains is acclaimed in puranas as being equal to all other ashrams on the planet put together. In the Theosophical literature, the Nilagiris Ashram of Agastya is referred to as the Ashram of Master Jupiter. Nilagiris is located in the heart center of the planet.




Around the beginning of the 20th century, a descent was prophesied which was to be an initiation to the Planet and the Planetary beings. The progress of the Planet and that of the beings of the Planet needed to be stepped up to meet the demands of the Time Plan of our system. The descent of higher energy via Sirius was planned in the higher circles and it was well-conceived in the sublime Ashrams of Himalayas, Nilagiris and five others on the planet. The Plan chose the Ashram of the Blue Mountains.

The Blue Mountains Ashram is the abode of Agastya. Agastya is the God or the Lord among the Rishis. The stupendous task of channelising the descent of energies from the higher systems was undertaken, and was ably handled by a special envoy of the Nilagiris ashram and is picked up later by the Himalayan Hierarchy for working it out further on the Planet.

This sacred place called the Durga mountain or the Rangaswamy pillar, considered to be the Ashram of Rishi Agastya. It is very uniquely placed in the north east corner of the Nilagiris. The mountain ranges gets its name as the blue mountains, through the colors that descend. The color blue belongs to the Master.

Nilagiris form the bridge between the Eastern and the Western ghats. It is also a point of fusion of east and west relating to the mountains of south India. It is said that Agastya has decided to stay in the south. Among Nilagiris, this is the peak which is called the peak of the Master. In the worldly parlance this is called Rangaswamy peak because there is the temple of Ranga (Krishna) here. Among the local tribes, it is known from the ancient most times as the mountain of Durga. The hill of Durga, is at the north east point of Nilagiris and from there it is connected to the eastern ghats with a valley and a lake which is called as the lake of Bhavani (Durga).

Agastya Maharshi as is known in the puranic symbolism is an embodiment of the cosmic will on the earth. He is considered to be Siva Swaroopa (embodiment of Siva).




The very contours of the peak show that it is like a huge sage sitting in a relaxed posture, one knee kept up and the other kept flat. One can feel the long plaits of hair falling on either side. He has his countenance in a slanting posture looking to the north. He is in the north east and is looking towards the north, in the direction of Lord Siva. We can also find some white mass which looks like the sacred ashes.

Infact the place where this mountain is, is called KoDanaDu meaning the place of the pot which means Kumbha. Kumbha is the Sanskrit term for the sun sign Aquarius. The center for energies of Aquarius is in this peak. It is from here the Master chose to descend into and incarnate in the town of Kumbhakonam, translated as the Aquarian angle. Kumbha konam is the angle of Aquarius and the kumbha is the ashram of the Master. Master CVV is said to be an advanced disciple from the Ashram of Master Agastya to whom the task of reception and distribution of the descending energies is entrusted.



Master EK also made a visit to the Nilagiris in the year 1962. In response to the invitation from Albert Sassi, Master EK stayed at Kotagiri in the Nilagiris. It is also here that wisdom of Spiritual Astrology was received by Master EK and once again given afresh to the humanity. The Master was visiting Nilagiris and in one of such visits, the ashram was revealed to him and ever since the followers of Master have been making Pilgrimage to the Mountain in Kodanadu, near Kotagiri of the Blue Mountains. The Master Mountain is now regularly visited since 1992 by the followers of the Path of Master Yoga.

Thereafter Master K. Parvathi Kumar has been relentlessly working with the energy of this Ashram and leading groups from East and West through the Path of Yoga of Master CVV.



With the guidance and blessings of Master K. Parvathi Kumar, a three day Group Living is planned in the Nilagiris.
