



Number 8 is a number of interacting nature. It is a symbol of double zeros, one placed on the other. The zero above represents Divinity. The zero below is its reflection. "As above, so below" is the message of this number.

Zero represents fullness, perfection, completeness. It indicates the perfection in Creation and perfection in its potential. That is why God -the symbol of Perfection- is referred to by number 8 in many theologies. Christ is also referred to by this number. Originally, much before Christ, Lord Krishna was referred to by this number. He was born in the 8th month, on the 8th moon phase as the 8th child. He is the One beyond the 7 planes and is therefore referred to as 8. The solar year commences from the sun sign Capricorn in the Divine Plan. From Capricorn, the sun sign Leo stands as the 8th month. An old commentary says thus:

"Gods are born at sunrise Man is born at noon Gods are born in Capricorn Man is born in Aries"

Thus, Lord Rama, an incarnation of Lord Vishnu, as the Perfect Man, was born in Aries, while Krishna, the Supreme Godhead, was born in the 8th month. Much more can be said about this.

On Secret Doctrine

Secrecy of Teachings



Pythagoras, Confucius, Buddha, Jesus, Apollonius of Tyana, Ammonius Saccas or any initiate has never committed to writing for public use. In recent times, Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Ramana Maharshi, Shirdi Sai, Master CVV never wrote for public use. All of them invariably recommended silence and secrecy on certain facts and deeds. Jesus himself commanded his disciples to tell no man that he was Christ. 'The left hand should not know what the right hand did', was the dictum of adepts. The disciples should not profit by publicity. If they do so, they harm themselves and their teacher.

The esoteric teachings and practices at all times are guarded and are not recklessly given away to exhibit one's superiority over their fellow beings. The disciples of the initiates are left with the task of sharing the parables while they themselves were duty-bound to follow the keynote of secret teaching without revealing the mysteries.

Pythagoras divided his classes into exoteric and esoteric lectures. The esoteric teachings were given during the odd hours of night unknown to the neighbourhood. He even preferred to give instructions in the far hidden caves. Many a time, magic was taught while exoterically it was said to be teaching of mathematics. In Pythagorean code, mathematics means esoteric science. Ammonius Saccas obligated his disciples by oath not to divulge his higher doctrines except to those who had been thoroughly instructed and exercised. One of the most powerful reasons for the necessity of strict secrecy is given by Jesus himself. In the Gospel of Matthew, Master is made to say 'Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, cast not pearls before the spine.'

When Anaxagoras pronounced the great truth that the sun was larger than the Peloponnesus (a peninsula south of Greece), he was persecuted and was nearly put to death by the fanatical mob. When Pythagoras shared in close circles that he is 'Son of Mercury', he was forced to flee for his life. Socrates would

not have been put to death had he kept secret the revelations he had. He declared even during those times that Moon was inhabited and the lunar beings live in profound, vast and dark valleys but it was absolutely disregarded. Today men of science pickup rockets to go to Moon, to confirm habitability on Moon. It is no wonder that secrecy is the essence of wisdom, when the lunatics are all around in the world.

The Building of the Antahkarana 4



The Antahkarana is built through right speech. Persons who do not have right speech, right thought and right action cannot have the Antahkarana built. Glamour and Illusion 2

Glamour is illusion on the emotional plane. Every individual, without exception, is subject to personal, group, national and racial glamour. To believe we are untouched by glamour is just another glamour. Glamour affects the daily life and all relationships. They are closely connected with an individual's environment, sex life, ambitions, desires, dreams, ideas and ideals, visions and aspirations. People are as they are because their individual glamour conditions their thinking and reactions. This renders them set in their ideas and creates an impenetrable fog, which distorts all contacts and prevents the truth ever reaching them. They do not see life or surrounding conditions truly or clearly. It makes right discrimination difficult or impossible.

The number of glamour is legion. Most individuals are subject to the glamour of materiality. They idealize and seek to identify themselves with the material world and to find satisfaction in purely physical pleasures and pursuits - in sex, food, money, material possessions, home, comfort and beauty. There is an intense glamour of preoccupation with them, with what concerns them, with what they like, with how they feel physically and emotionally, with their reaction to people, environment and the material aspects of daily living. They whirl at the centre of their daily life, seeing nothing of reality, hearing nothing but the reverberations of their own thoughts, and - consequently and inevitably - getting no true joy out of life.

Verna in Sanskrit means sound and colour. The Teacher is of multiple colours and sounds. There is but one sound that details into many, likewise there is one colour that details into many. He also imparts different sounds to the same follower depending upon the need that is felt. He leads beings through sound and colour from mutability to immutability in one's own being and stabilizes them in their original immutable state.

Very early in the morning I recollect the holy sandals of the Master in the inner chamber of my heart.





The Double Triangle 2

Below the Throat Centre there are three centres which are: the Solar Plexus, the Sacral Centre and the Base Centre. Above the Throat Centre we have three centres which are: the Heart Centre, the Brow Centre, and the Head Centre. The Head, the Brow and the Heart Centres are called the "Three Higher Centres", and the Solar Plexus, the Sacral and the Base Centres, are called the "Three Lower Centres".

The Three Higher Centres reflect in the Lower Centres via the Throat Centre. The Throat Centre is number 4, and the Three Higher Centres 1, 2, and 3 reflect themselves as 5, 6, and 7.

In so far as we know how to work with the Throat Centre, we are in a position to link up the Higher with the Lower, to link up the unknown with the known and to link up that which is imperceptible with that which is perceptible.


Dip - Deep



This gives an idea of dipping something to the mind. Then it awakens the meaning of dipping the consciousness into itself (rather a subjective dip). The term deep indicates to the chooser the State of Experience before creation, a dip of the known consciousness into unknown levels. The deep in the cosmos is filled with darkness or subjectivity. Since there was no second before this creation, it was only subjectivity that was existing. From a separated stage and to the created consciousness the subjectivity is called darkness.

In man also that layer of absolute consciousness, which we call subjectivity, is darkness to the awakened mind. Such a stage is experienced during sleep by everyone, but since the mind is suspended during sleep, this stage is not known by the man of mind. When the consciousness of the man is awakened into the sleep state without his mind being awakened, it is understood as the experience of subjectivity or sleep. Then, there will be a state of active subjectivity which is called the fourth state of experience by the Masters of Yoga. (The other three states are, the state of objective consciousness, the state of sleep and state of dream. These three states are recognised by every man as existing). The fourth state is not noticed by a non-yogic mind because the fourth state is to be experienced in the absence of mind and in the presence of consciousness. Consciousness without mind is the key-note of this fourth state.

Dipping the conscious mind into naught is aimed at and achieved by the two terms DIP-DEEP. This process is initiated by virtue of the mind coming into consciousness with the ordinary meaning of these two terms. At this stage, man experiences the Pralaya state as interpenetrating background and the omni-presence of that stage operating as the background of the created world. By experiencing this state, man can exist in that state without associating with the chain actions of the creation while living in it simultaneously. This makes possible the seedless experience of man which does not touch the chain actions of the universe.

Experience Soul/Self (I Am)

Thus, one can hang for a while the robe of personality and the robe of body to a coat-hanger and be a soul! It is the simplest way and far better than strenuously trying to repair the body and repair the personality to experience the soul. This path of repairing is a laborious path. Instead stand out from them and experience the soul. Once one realises that one is a soul, one remains intact even while one is in an imperfect personality or imperfect body. As soul one can even repair faster one's personality and body. As personality one cannot repair one's own personality. An imperfect personality is like a broken hand. When the hands are broken, what repair can one do to oneself? An imperfect personality when it attempts to perfect itself fails in doing so, because it is imperfect. Therefore, the easier way is observation, witnessing, watching oneself.

When one watches within, when one witnesses within one's body one sees many things. One sees the functioning of awareness flowing from oneself. One can also see life and its flowing through the self. One can see the functioning of the solar system in oneself. One can also see the inner astronomy and astrology. The science of observation or witnessing is a great science by itself, by which many attain to be the soul. To be a soul is to get back to the original state of Be-ness. Such Be-ness is blissful. Money 1

Question: Dear Master, what should be the attitude of the aspirants with regard to money?

Answer: Dear friend,

- The aspirants should know that there is value for money only when such money is pressed into service.
- He should know that money enables him to equip himself for the work to be done but not for oneself.
- He should know the value of money for what it can purchase for use of others.
- He should know that money has an occult significance and is one of the greatest tests to the aspirants. His attitude and his handling of money should mostly be to serve others but not to gratify one's own desires.
- He should necessarily know that the aspirant who desires not money for himself can be recipient of financial bounties. He shall be the dispenser of the riches of the universe.
- He should know that money meant for self-gratification brings with it sorrow, distress, discontentment and misuse.
- He should know that at all times the aspirant should keep himself with utmost implicitly and let not pomp and publicity.

The Wisdom of Nakshatras

Star 13: Hasta



Hasta is the constellation of manifestation. Hasta means "hand". The natives of this constellation are dexterous with their hands. Any art or science involving the use of hands is best suited to the natives of Hasta. They tend to be very good healers and cooks. They have a very good hand and mind coordination. Their mind is also full of enthusiasm to work. With the related intuition,

they can work out magical manifestations. They have one-pointed attention and concentration.

The Moon is the ruler of the constellation. The Hasta moon is open, receptive, and develops an intuitive understanding. The Hasta natives are flexible and adaptable. They relate well to ground realities. On the surface, they seem to be very confident but suffer insecurity within their being.

The lord of the constellation is Savitr, the Central Sun, and the mantra best suited for them is Gayatri.

The unique feature of Hasta is that the natives do not get involved in challenges and fights. They do not engage in debates and discussions; they feel such an activity is a waste of time. There is an anecdote in this regard. Once a giant (a diabolic one) challenges the Sun to fight with him or accept defeat. The Sun smilingly replied, "I may be defeated or I may be defeating you, either way I have no interest. I have work to do, which I would not like to set aside for fights and challenges." This attitude is the beauty of Hasta.

Since this constellation constitutes the central theme of Virgo, the natives are endowed with purity of thought. Their hands are clean, in the sense that they do not involve in unlawful activity. Their inspiration is the Central Sun whose energy they receive from the head unto their palms. They perform well and are generally contended. They are light and swift. The hands in the human body represent Hasta. While the number is 13, the favourable number is 2. Since number 2 is the number of the Moon, they have cool and calm nature. Number 13, being a number of conflicts, they are surrounded always by conflicting situations. The beauty of the natives of Hasta is that they smile away their difficulties and do not succumb to the hardships of life. They remain simple, quiet and cool with much patience springing from within.

The Hasta natives catch cold and cough with every weather change.

Hasta consists of five stars and looks like an elephant head with its trunk. For this reason, the elephant-headed god is related to this constellation and is specially worshipped. When the Sun is in Virgo and the Moon is in Hasta constellation, Ganesha, the elephant-headed deity, is worshipped all over India to derive the benefits of the constellation. Ganesha is a deity with allround virtues and it is seen as the cosmic son of the virgin, the World Mother. He bestows energies to fulfil oneself. He rounds up the angularities of personality and ensures all-round development. He is also seen as Cosmic Jupiter and all that relates to Jupiterian energy. The natives of Hasta would do well by worshipping Ganesha, besides contemplating upon Gayatri. The Moon visits Hasta every month and that has to be particularly noted to relate to Ganesha for self-fulfilment.

The natives of Hasta are resourceful, pleasant and practical. The animal symbol relating to Hasta is the elephant head.

The colour is light green, since Mercury also shines forth in this constellation besides the Moon. The tree relating to this constellation is hog-plum (maredu), considered as one of the most sacred trees in the Vedic order. The body parts are



the lateral sides. The stone is topaz. The bird is a vulture. The animal is a female buffalo.

The natives of Hasta would do well to consume the neem herb from time to time to set their stomachs in good order.

Hasta also means "the smiling one". "Has" in Sanskrit means smile. The natives of Hasta generally carry a smile on their countenance and make light of the life situations. Hasta is considered to be a levelling nakshatra, meaning, it flourishes well on the plane land compared to mountain regions. They can be good agriculturalists and traders. Light-hearted work suits them. Since the Moon is the ruler, Hasta natives have waxing and waning moods. Because Mercury is another ruler, they have the knack of discriminating and avoiding conflictive situations. The Hasta native can be a good handy person who delivers well by receiving the instructions. They are masters of manifestation but they require guidance.

Number 13, though conflicting by nature, is seen as the number associated with occult subjects. Hasta natives generally are comfort-oriented and quiet performers in the world. However, if their inclination turns inward, they would quickly gain an understanding of the intricacies of the esoteric science.

Swami Vivekananda, the famous Indian saint, was born in this constellation. He impacted the globe with the inner dimension of Vedic Philosophy.

On a lighter vein, Hasta natives' dexterity with the hand can make them good pickpockets, card players, and casino dealers. They are good with a "sleight of hand". They can be good sculptors, masons and so on.

In such activity, teaching is seen as vertical activity and listening is seen as horizontal activity. A teacher helps the student to qualitatively improve his life gradually. If that does not happen, the teaching has no meaning. Likewise, healing has no meaning if it does not enable the patient to live less unhealthy life. The patient should be educated to lead a life where he does not fall sick repeatedly. A good healer is one who has healed the mind and the body, and has enabled the soul to work in harmony with its mind and body. This is also gradual.

All human activity is service to the humans or to the animals or to the plants or to the minerals. The humans are born to serve. Like other beings, they need to align to know how to serve. Knowing how to serve they have to serve. They have to strive to serve better every day. Such is the noble work of an aspirant. The knowledge given in the group life is to help the group to align better, thereby comprehend better and finally serve better. Let that be the object of this group life, too.

Vishnu Purana Chapter XXVII

Position and Magnitude of the Sun and other Planetary Bodies 2

The East is the abode of the Vasus while the South is the point of control over all the forces. The West is the abode of water and the North is the abode of darkness. The Sun passes through the meridian along the path of the ecliptic like an arrow escaping through the fundamental units of time. Thus, the Sun serves as the officiated installer of the division of the day and night with all their subdivisions. The upward path is called the path of Devas (the path of lights) and it removes the obstacles of those who follow the Yogic path. The upward path of consciousness along the spinal column is governed by the apparent path of the Sun in its diurnal motion. Always the Sun forms the centre of all units of the day, from sunrise to sunrise. The Sun travels along said marked points and during the night it travels through the nether regions. During sunrise and sunset its rays flood in all directions. The point where it appears at any given point on Earth is called the sunrise at that point. The point where it disappears is called the due West of that point. There is neither emerging nor merging of the Sun at any time. Only the appearance and disappearance of the apparent sun globe are marked here. As it travels, the Sun touches the three cities during the day (the East, the Meridian and the West). If you take the upper half of the segment that begins with sunrise and ends with sunset and join the points from the meridian you will get the three points.


From sunrise, the Sun ascends with increasing heat of its rays. Again from the meridian it descends with decreasing heat. This emerging and merging form the first and second halves of the day. The Meridian forms the summit of what we call Mount Meru. All Devas (Gods of Light) assemble on this summit. They open their office of lights and close it according to their strict timings.

Some people take the North, midnight, as the beginning of measuring for the whole day. The Meru from any given point is the highest of all measurement

points. During night time, the brilliance of the Sun is absent. Then the consciousness which we call light enters what we call fire on this Earth; hence fire is seen from a distance at night. At sunrise the light is taken back by the Sun once again. Since the Sun is the greatest light of all, it shines above all sources of illumination during the day. The light of the Sun and fire manifest in the form of light and heat. They enter each other and vitalise the night and the day.


When the Northern and Southern hemispheres are illuminated by the Sun, the energy of the Sun enters the waters on Earth to make them conscious. At the beginning of the day and night (during both twilights) the waters of this Earth appear as copper coloured. It is during that time that the Devas and Asuras, the intelligences who govern the awakening and sleep of beings, begin to operate. The day merges into water (the bottom of the fourth house) when the Sun sets. This is the reason why the waters at night - the seminal fluid of the many being who cohabit at night - serve as the liquid of germination.

The Sun creates all this, standing at the centre as if at the mid-point of a lotus. Thus, the Sun forms a replica of the four-faced Brahma on the lotus seat. The whole duration of the day and night is taken as a unit and a 30th part of it is called a Muhurtha. The Sun appears as if standing at the edge of a potter's wheel rotating. During its rotation, the Sun makes the day wherever it is facing and makes the night whenever it leaves.

Planet and Diseases



The esoteric science indicates that all the formations to the beings emerge from the material of this earth. The atoms of the dense physical body of all the beings and also that of the human beings are composed from the matter of this earth. The earth is an evolving planet and therefore has its deficiencies. Its inherent life also suffers from certain blockages and hence its material body also suffers the related deficiencies. There is some truth in the theologies which state that to be born on earth is a kind of punishment. The planet is evolving and its beings on the planet are also evolving. The planet as well as the beings are shedding the dense matter and are progressing towards less dense, more subtle matter. The denser the matter is it harbours diseases. Since the physical atoms relating to our planet carry inherent deficiency, their life cycle is also limited. This is one of the chief factors determining the ageing

and the death of the physical body. The inner man has no age. He is the ancient one. His body grows, decays and dies through time. This is because of the limited longevity of atoms.

Another kind of disease that emerges from that planet due to human irresponsibility are epidemics that have a serious effect upon human race after every significant war. No doubt the planet is endowed with great power of absorption. But it has its limits. The aftermath of war is one such limitation that would lead to the epidemics. Europe specially suffered the epidemic due to two great wars. Till date it is not entirely free of this vulnerability though there is much scientific knowledge to contain epidemics. An epidemic is an outrage of Nature.

A 3rd kind of disease that emerges from the planet is due to human ignorance. For untold eons the bodies of men and animals have been laid away in the ground and the soil of the planet is impregnated with the germs. These germs produced diseases in a subtle form which is not yet recognized by science. The germs of ancient, unknown diseases are to be found in the layers of the soil and the subsoil.

The nature never intended that the bodies be buried in the ground. The bodies of the animals return to the dust purified by the rays of the Sun and by the breezes that blow. The Sun causes death as well as life. The Sunrays can kill the bacteria with its dry heat. Moisture and darkness breed diseases from the buried bodies. When all the nations as a rule cremate the dead bodies there would be a great reduction in disease and much healthier world.

The Masters of Wisdom (Overseas Messages - XI)


